

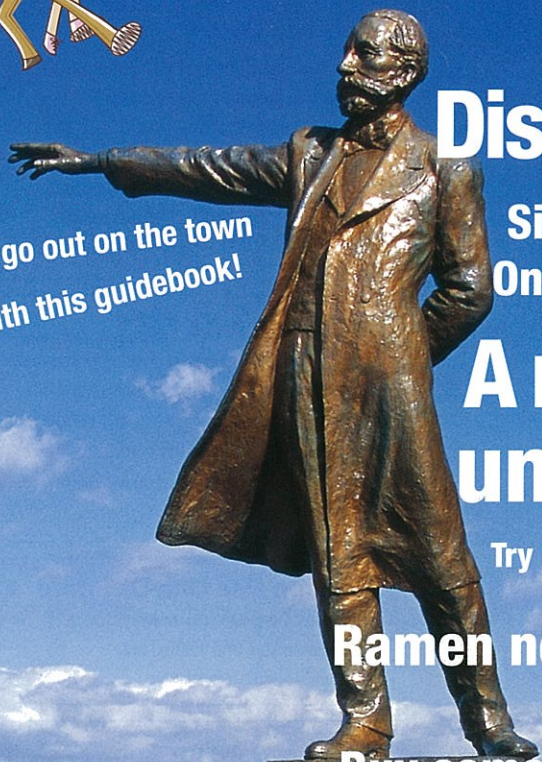

With You Card

Available for all Subway lines, Street cars, Chuo bus, JR Hokkaido bus, and Jotetsu bus.
It is convenient for transit.

IC Card SAPICA ¥2000

Available for the subway. Reusable/Rechargeable.
You can simply swipe the SAPICA card across the top of an electronic sensor when passing through the ticket gate. It will even work if the card is concealed in your wallet, as long as you press it on the SAPICA sensor.

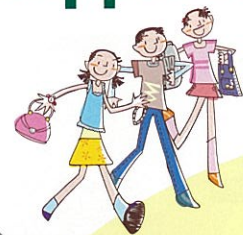
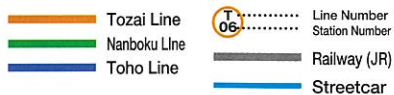

Subway

There are three subway lines, Namboku (green) line, Tozai (orange) line, and Toho (blue) line, and "Odori" Station is the hub of the three lines. To help you navigate the subway system more easily, please note the color and number of the station.

Streetcar

A streetcar runs between "Nishi 4-chome" and "Susukino".
The "Dosanko Pass" (¥300) is a one-day card valid only on streetcars on Saturdays, Sundays, and national holidays.

JR railway

There are three types of railway transport in Hokkaido: Limited Express, Rapid Train, and Local.
For limited express travel, an additional express fare is required.

When the remaining credit of the With You Card is less than ¥200:

[Before boarding]: Insert the card into the ticket machine, add cash and/or an additional card with remaining credit, then purchase your ticket.

[When getting off]: Insert the card into the Fare Adjustment Machine (if you transit to the streetcar/bus, please press transit button for streetcar/bus) and pay with cash or same kind of card, you will receive a Fare Adjustment ticket, use it to exit the gate.

For the streetcar and bus: pay additional fare in cash or with same type of card when getting off.
*Note that you can insert up to two cards.

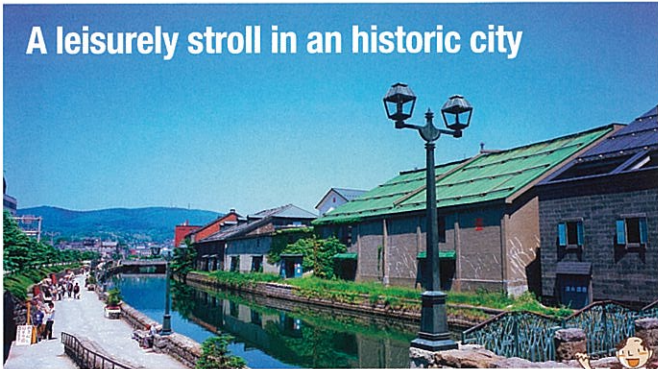

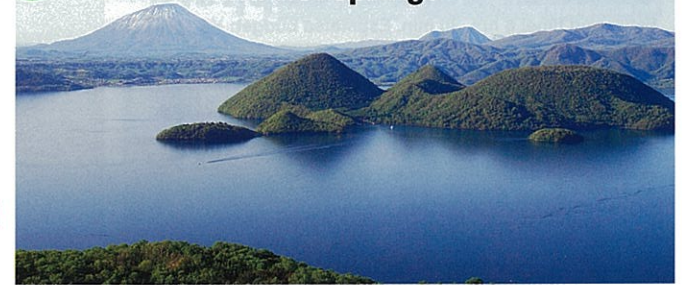


Variety of over 25,000 items in the Music box shop. The steam clock tower in front of the main entrance is a famous landmark.

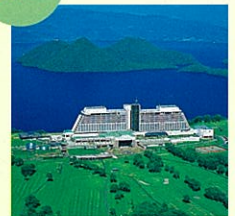

58 sculptures are arranged in this outdoor sculpture park around Lake Toya.

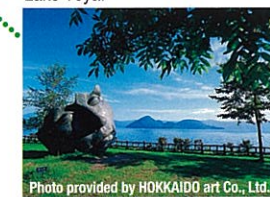

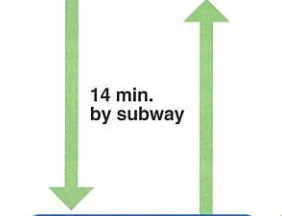
ROUTE 1 Complete All-Day Tour (sightseeing, shopping, and eating)

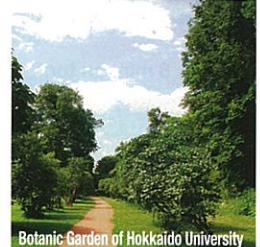

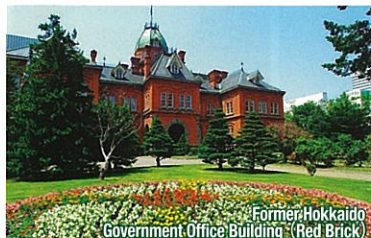
Sapporo Beer Museum
This museum introduces the history of beer manufacturing. A giant copper brew kettle that was once used in the beer making process is on display.



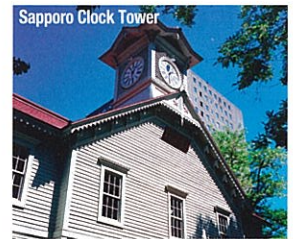
Sapporo Factory

Botanic Garden of Hokkaido University
Approximately 4,000 kinds of plant such as primeval forest from the pioneer days are open to the public. There is also a museum to exhibit samples of rare animals.



Former Hokkaido Government Office Building (Red Brick)
Office of the former directors and office of the governor is open to the public. It is designated as an important cultural property.



Sapporo Clock Tower
It was built in 1878 as a drill hall for Sapporo Agricultural College. Being the oldest clock tower in Japan, it is an important cultural symbol that keeps on ticking! **Admission fee: ¥200**

ROUTE 2 For those who want to spend a relaxing time viewing wildlife and scenery

Maruyama Area

Estimated time: 5 hrs. 40 min. Estimated budget: ¥2,100
Maruyama area is a quiet residential area with fancy shops. You can enjoy the beauty of 4 different seasons and feel the healing power of nature.

Located in the north area of a primeval forest, Maruyama Park is full of greenery, and many people come to view cherry blossoms in the spring season.

It is open throughout the year, and approx. 60 kinds of experience programs are popular.

Admission fee: ¥600

Okurayama Jump Hill
If you go up to the top by chair-lift with close look of the ski jump board, you can enjoy a wonderful view of Sapporo from the observatory at a height of 307 meters above sea level. You can experience the same feeling as the ski jumpers just before they jump!

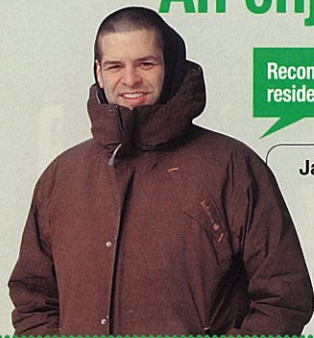

In Japan, it's not rude to make sounds while eating noodles, so don't worry about it!

Questions like: "What can you eat or drink for 2000 yen?", "What is some typical Sapporo food?", are answered here. You may find your favorite restaurant in this section.

Japanese Cuisine

Definitely go to an Izakaya! Izakayas have a variety of food at reasonable prices.

You must taste Japanese cuisine while in Japan. Izakaya is like a Japanese traditional pub where a variety of Japanese foods are served at reasonable prices in a casual atmosphere.

●Sashimi (Raw fish)

Hokkaido's fish is fresh and tasty. Even if you are not into raw fish, just give it a try!

●Yakitori (Grilled skewered chicken)

Yakitori is chicken skewered with a bamboo stick and grilled. It is seasoned with either salt or a special sauce. It is quite popular among non-Japanese.

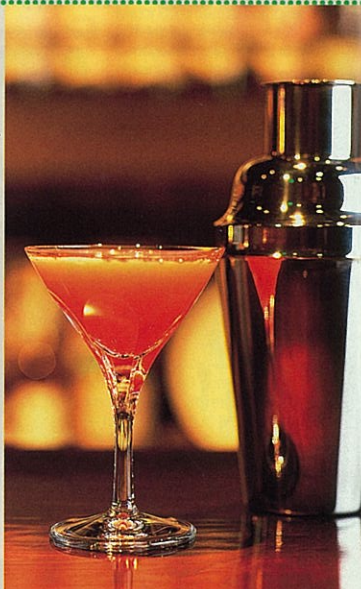

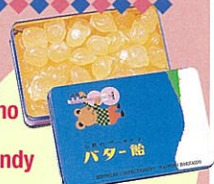

Brief History

Hokkaido's History began when the Kaitakushi (Hokkaido Development Commission) was established in the Sapporo area in 1869. The Kaitakushi started manufacturing various products such as wine, beer, flour, and agricultural products that have become the main industries of Hokkaido today. The Sapporo subway system began operating in 1971. The first Winter Olympic games ever held in Asia was hosted by Sapporo in 1972. Sapporo continues to aspire toward being an international city, selected as one of the venues of the 2002 FIFA World Cup soccer competition.

Main Events

Feb. "Sapporo Snow Festival" is a grand event of snow and ice, attracting more than 2 million people each year. Be sure not to miss the giant snow sculptures!

Jun. More than 300 teams participate in the "YOSAKOI Soran" festival, performing energetic group dance routines in the streets of Sapporo. The Hokkaido Shrine Festival is also held every June.

Jul. "Odori Beer Garden" is the feature event of summer in Sapporo. Enjoy beer with small or large groups at Odori Park! Various performances are held there as well.

Dec. "Sapporo White Illumination" is truly an illuminated light spectacle in the early winter season when the park is filled with decorative lighting. In the same venue, the "German Christmas Market" is also held in celebration of Sapporo's sister city, Munich. Many charming shops sell German-themed holiday decorations and foods.
